

Priority Business

COVID

- Dane County Mask Mandate:
 - Mask mandate will be dropped county-wide on Tuesday, June 2
 - o County estimates that 75% of eligible population will have first dose by then
 - We can come up with our own policy. Approaches:
 - Continue to require masks, at least for a while (2 weeks more? Specific county vaccination rate?)
 - Drop mask requirements for vaccinated members
 - Members to voluntarily offer a copy of their vaccination cards?
 - Honor system?
 - Drop mask requirements entirely
 - Woodshop to continue with masking policy until further notice
- We do not want to police masking in the fact that if someone wants to wear a mask, we do not tell them that they need to take it off/don't need it anymore
- JimV if we're in the woodshop late at night, only one person, can we have a person limit for wearing masks? Such as if there's only one person in the woodshop late at night and the door is open, is a mask needed? Setting a specific policy?
 - We are delegating to the area captains for decisions on masking in specific areas
 - Jim is a team player but wants to note that actually wearing a mask can fog up glasses and make working in the woodshop more dangerous
- Timm after June 2nd as the county drops their mask mandate, fully vaccinated people can be maskless (honor system), but instructors and area captains can set restrictions and we're not going to harass folks about it.
 - Seconded: Jared
 - o CDC guidelines are for fully vaccinated, 2 weeks after your shot

Summary of the May 12, 2021 Bodgery Expansion Planning Meeting

There was a Bodgery Expansion Planning Meeting on the evening of May 12. Eighteen people were in attendance. Notification of the meeting was previously provided on the Slack #announcements channel and #bodgery-expansion channel.

The first Bodgery expansion decision being tackled is where an expanded woodshop should go. The woodshop has experienced a lot of growth in usage. Being a large space, this is being decided first. Consideration has been given to:

- 1. Using all of Suite B, the 7,840 square feet of expansion space next door, for the wood shop. This provides excellent dust and noise separation from the rest of the shop. General consensus was that this amount of space for the woodshop limits expansion for current areas and addition of new areas.
- 2. Using a part of Suite B next door for the woodshop. A dividing wall would be needed for dust/noise separation between the woodshop and other uses in Suite B. The conclusion was that this has no

advantages over other options but has the disadvantages of putting in more infrastructure (a large dividing wall, a lot of electrical, HVAC changes).

- 3. Woodshop expands into the big shop to Truss 16 which is located in the middle of the current CNC area. At the meeting it was stated that this option isn't enough space for the woodshop. No one advocated for this option.
- 4. Woodshop expands into the big shop to Truss location 16.5 which is located between the CNC and machining areas. This option has the best space utilization of all the options because it provides the woodshop a good amount of space but does not affect the machining area. This was the preferred option of the board and the woodshop area captains going into this meeting. But then the next option won out.
- 5. Woodshop expands into the big shop to Truss 17 which is located in the machining area. Aligning the new woodshop dividing wall with a Truss (16 or 17) has mechanical and aesthetic advantages (truss above, no windows on the side). At Truss 17, the two heaters in the big shop are split into rooms that are 3/7 and 4/7 of the big shop where previous options have a less balanced heater load. The disadvantage of changing the machining area footprint can be alleviated by moving the machining area to Suite B.

Currently, the leading proposal for woodshop is the last one listed, expanding to Truss 17. Once this basic decision is made, more detailed planning of other areas can be done. And the clock is ticking. The lease is signed. The landlord is contracting to make repairs and changes to Suite B, including installing doors between Suite B and our current space (Suite C). But it will take a couple of months for the contractors to get the new space prepped for us. Expect more planning and decision making soon. The best way to stay involved and up-to-date is to subscribe to the Slack #bodgery-expansion channel.

 - New tracking category for additional storage in Xero

 - What should we do about potential projects?
