

Priority Business

EZ Robot Presentation

Dennis - educational robotics for 10 years. First 6 years reselling educational technology and running programs in schools. Taught more than 20,000 students. Speaks on conferences.

Background on forecasts for robotics and AI, agriculture, medical etc.

Will be disruptive on workforce, 1 billion people will need retraining due to robotics and AI transforming the workplace

People think of robotics as siloed industries. But this will act much like computers did, when people think we needed programmers. The missed change was that we all needed computer literacy. For robotics education, it is not looked from the perspective of building roboticists, the most important thing for Dennis is to bring robotics literacy

Hopefully many millions of new jobs that will be high tech. This will accelerate in the next 5-7 years.

The forecasts for retraining is \$24000 per worker. Wants to bring robotics literacy for everyone. Want to get schools to implement robotics technology more. Schools are pivoting too slowly, trying to approach the problem by having makerspaces and libraries teaching kids instead. Most makerspaces are nonprofits which may not have the resources. They have a curriculum that can be used to teach adults and children.

If we need funding from corporate sponsors, Dennis is happy to talk to them.

They have different kinds of kits. Classes are designed to teach people who have no experience to becoming programmers

Who are the intended teachers?

Trains teachers without experience in 2-3 hours. Curriculum is free, robots for purchase.

Problem with bandwidth of our volunteer base?

Program would generate revenue if we hired people.

Internal discussion:
