Items from Last Meeting

- We should start thinking about setting aside money each month, putting it into a fund/contingency account for big expenses such as next year's insurance payments. How soon should we start doing this, and how?
 - 6 months expenses is roughly \$8,500.
 - UW Credit Union has associated Savings Account. We can easily transfer money into it over time, until it reaches a Rainy Day Fund. Board thought \$10,000 would be a good amount for an "Emergency Fund".
 - Once Google pays us, the board recommends putting \$4,000 into that account.
- Should The Bodgery set up scholarships for memberships? 1 month, 3 month? Goal for this should be defined.
 - Difference between "Financial Hardship" scholarship and Non-Financial Hardship version was fuzzy, so board decided to stay with Financial Hardship model. Again, max at 10% of current membership.
 - The Treasurer should send out a standard email to departing members asking if they'd be willing to share why.
 - If it's due to financial reasons, that person can be brought to the board as a possibility for a "financial hardship" scholarship (as long as there's an opening).
